Note #1

The RN-BSN program is a 3 semester program.

It takes one year for students to complete the program unless they choose to attend part-time.

Note #2

Students typically transfer in all of their general education requirements. All gen eds from accredited Community College grads are transferred in to meet the PW general education requirements. Diploma grads who transfer in typically need an Arts & Humanities course, possibly a Natural Science class, and MATH 1220, or STAT 2000, or STAT 2020. Student prefer to take the Math/Stat class during the winter session or they will take it during their last semester so that they don't need to take more than 12 credits in a given semester.
